2.1 Organ Donation Policy

Why in news?

- Recently **Union Health Minister** has reviewed the **status of organ donations and transplant** with senior officers of the Health Ministry.

Important information

- The number of **total organ transplants** in the country has substantially **increased from less than 5000** in the year 2013 to more than **15000 in the year 2022**.
- In the year **2016, 2265 organs were utilized from 930 deceased donors** while **2765 could be utilized from 904 deceased donors in the year 2022**.

Organ donation policy:

- Coordination at: **National (NOTTO), Regional (ROTO) and State level (SOTTO)**
- NOTTO: National Organ and Tissue Transplant Organization.**
- Transplantation of Human Organs **Act, 1994**.
- NOTTO was established** under the Transplantation of Human Organs (**Amendment**) Act, 2011.
- Nodal Ministry: **Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.**
- Only close relatives & blood relation** are in a condition to donate organ otherwise **NOTTO registration is mandatory.**
- Recently, Govt. of India has **granted Special Casual Leaves of up to 42 days** to **Central Govt. Employees, who donate an organ** to another human being, as a special welfare measure in public interest.

 - Dispute Settlement.
 - Movement of Natural Persons.
 - Telecom.
 - Customs Procedures.
 - Pharmaceutical products.
 - Government Procurement.
 - Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), Investment, Digital Trade and Cooperation in other Areas
- It is **projected to reach US\$100 billion in goods trade** and **over US\$15 billion in trade in services** in the **next five years**. Built on **three pillars of trust, transparency, and talent**.
- India has obtained **immediate duty elimination on over 80% of its tariff lines** corresponding to 90% of India's exports in value terms.
- Events to **commemorate the first anniversary of CEPA**.

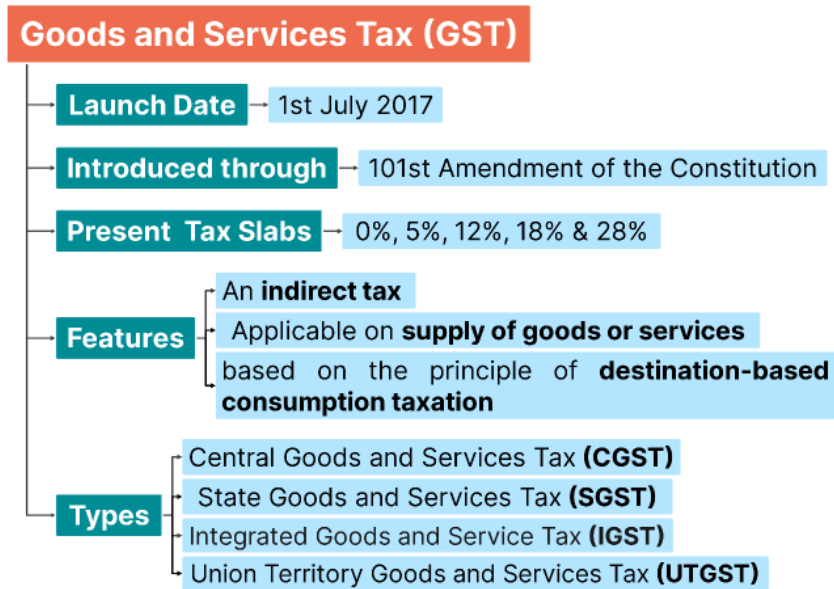
2.9 GST revenue collection for April 2023

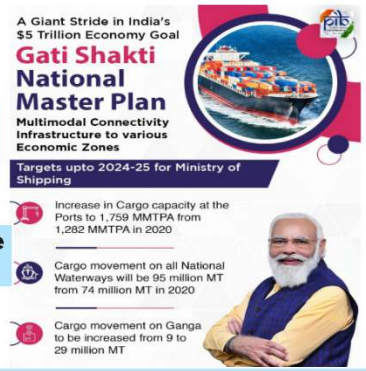
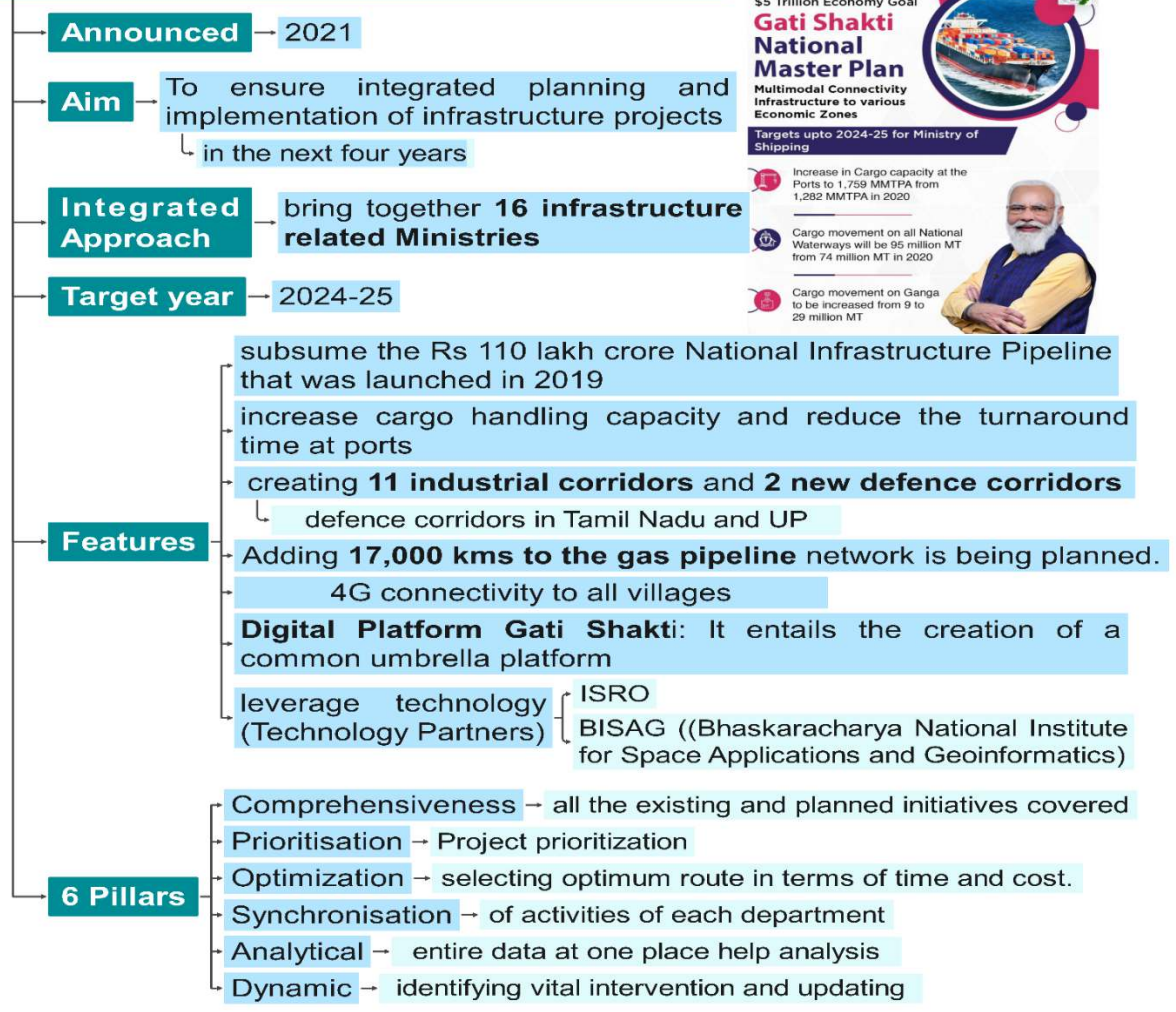

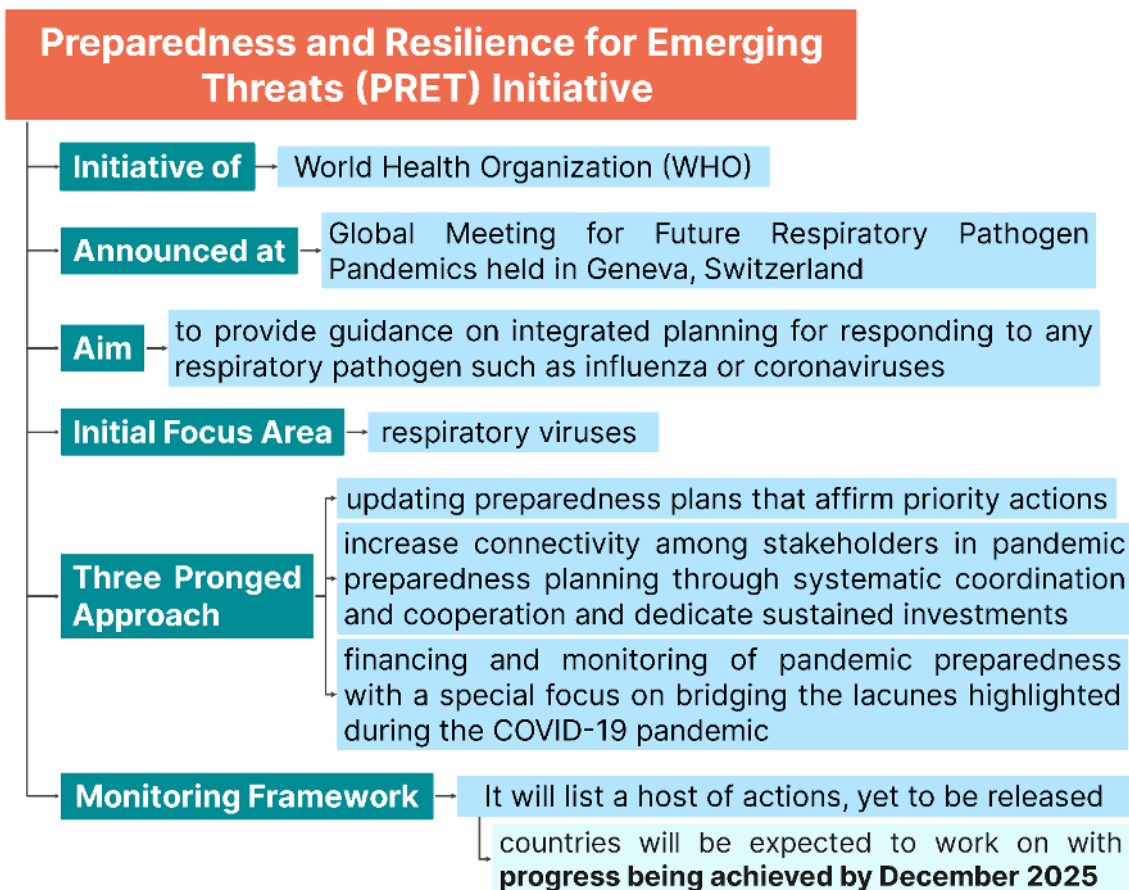

2.20 New GST rules for businesses with turnover of over Rs 100 crore

Why in News?

- Recently, the GST Network has informed that **businesses whose turnover is Rs 100 crore and above** must **upload their electronic invoices** on **Invoice Registration Portal (IRP)** **within 7 days of the issue of such invoice**.
- This rule **came into effect from May 1, 2023**.

Additional Information

- At present, businesses with turnover of Rs 10 crore and above are required to generate electronic invoice for all B2B transactions.
- As per GST law, businesses cannot avail input tax credit (ITC) if invoices are not uploaded on the IRP.

2.2120 Point Programme

Why in News?

- Recently the **Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation** has shared data regarding 20 Point Programme.

Important Information

- **Number of parameters tracked: 14**
- Interval of Tracking: **quarterly**.
- Date for the period of: **April-December 2022**.

- **The progress report** in parameters of 20 Point Programme:
- Out of 14 the government achieved a **more than 90% target completion ("very good") in six parameters.**
- **80-90% ("good") in five parameters.**
- The performance in **three of parameters was "poor" or below 80% target.** (viz., area covered under **plantation** (public and forest lands) and (**construction of roads under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY)**
- Under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Gramin) or **PMAY-G, 82% of the targeted 4 million houses were constructed.**
- The government plans to **advance the deadline of PMAY-G to December 2023 from March 2024.**
- In **electricity supply, it achieved 99%** of the target.
- Made **0.51 million pump sets energised**, against the **target of 0.34 million** during this period.
- **Financial outlay (for 20 Point Programme): ₹54,487 crore** for the scheme, **up 12.5% from 2023-24** (revised estimates)
- **Shortfall in target achievement:**
 - Target of **constructing 35,385 km of roads** during April-December 2022, **only 18,808 km, or 53%, of roads were completed.**
- **The 20 Point Programme:**
 - **Launch year: 1975**
 - Aim: **eradicating poverty** and improving the **quality of life** for the common man.
 - The program has been **revised several times**, most **recently in 2006** to align with **economic reforms, liberalisation, and globalisation.**
 - The TPP-2006 consists of **65 items that align with the programs and schemes** being implemented by different Ministries/Departments of the Indian government.

3.1 Listing of REC's Green Bonds

Why in News?

- Recently, **REC Limited** has undertaken an **exclusive listing** of its **Green bonds** of **USD 750 million** in **NSE International Exchange and India INX** at **Gujarat International Finance Tech-city (GIFT)- International Financial Services Centre (IFSC).**

- It is the **first Green Bond issuance** by an **Indian Company** post India's **G20 Presidency**.
- It is the **largest ever senior USD tranche** by an **Indian NBFC**.
- It is the **largest ever senior Green Bond Tranche** by a **South & South-East Asian issuer**.
- REC has issued the green bonds under its **USD 7 billion Global Medium Term Note Programme**
 - With this listing, **REC's total listing now stands at USD 4.75 billion** under the USD 7 billion Global Medium Term Note Programme

About Green Bonds

- Green Bonds are **debt instruments** issued by **public and private entities** to **finance eco-friendly projects**.

3.2 Legal Identity Identifier (LEI) System by SEBI

Why in News?

- Recently, the Securities & Exchange Board of India (**SEBI**) has introduced **Legal Entity Identifier (LEI) system for issuers** that have **listed or planning to list non-convertible securities, securitised debt instruments and security receipts**.
- **Timeline to obtain and report the LEI Code**

About Legal Entity Identifier (LEI)

- It is a **unique global identifier** for **legal entities participating in financial transactions**.
- Each LEI comprise a **20-digit alphanumeric code**

- It is designed to create a global reference data system that uniquely identifies every legal entity, in any jurisdiction, that is party to a financial transaction.
- In India, the LEI code can be obtained from **Legal Entity Identifier India Ltd**, a subsidiary of the Clearing Corporation of India Ltd.
 - Legal Entity Identifier India Ltd has been **recognized as by the RBI as issuer of LEI**.
 - It has been **accredited** by the Global Legal Entity Identifier Foundation (**GLEIF**) as the **local operating unit in India** for issuance and management of LEI code.

- **Timeline released by RBI for borrowers to obtain LEI**

3.3 Transition Bonds

Why in News?

- Recently, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (**SEBI**) has mandated **additional requirements** for the **issuance and listing of transition bonds**.

Key Guidelines

- The issuer of transition bonds will have to make the following **additional disclosures** in the **offer document** for **public issues or private placements** of such transition bonds.
 - Details of interim targets, along with an indicative timeline for achieving the targets.
 - Information about the brief of the project implementation strategy
 - Details regarding the usage of technology for the project implementation
 - Mechanism to oversee the utilisation of the funds raised through transition bonds and the implementation of the transition plan.
- To differentiate transition bonds from other categories of green debt security, the issuer of transition bonds will have to use a denotation '**GB-T**'.

About Transition Bonds

- It is one of the **sub-categories** of **green debt security**.
- Transition Bonds are issued for raising funds for transitioning to a more sustainable form of operations in line with India's intended nationally determined contributions.

3.4 G20 TechSprint

Why in News?

- Recently, the Reserve Bank of India (**RBI**), **under India's G20 Presidency**, & Bank for International Settlements Innovation Hub (**BISIH**) have jointly launched the **G20 TechSprint (fourth edition)**.
- It is a **global technology competition** for **developing innovative solutions to improve cross-border payments**.
- **Three Focus Areas of 2023 TechSprint**

- Anti-Money Laundering (AML) / Combating terrorist financing (CFT) /Sanctions technology solutions to reduce illicit finance risk
- FX and liquidity technology solutions to enable settlement in more emerging market and developing economy (EMDE) currencies.
- Technology solutions for multilateral cross-border Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) platforms.

3.5 HDFC Bank launches retail banking programme 'Vishesh'

Why in News?

- **HDFC Bank** has launched a retail banking initiative called '**Vishesh**', aimed at customers in **semi-urban and rural areas**.
- The bank is hoping to onboard **1 lakh new customers**, which involves increasing its branch network and developing bespoke financial products for the market segment.
- The bank plans to add **675 branches** in rural and semi-urban areas **by 2024**, with the total number expected to reach almost 5,000.
